Christmas is only three sleeps away, and we would like to sincerely thank everyone who participated in our *Christmas Gifts with a Difference* project. Once again, it was a wonderful success.

Through your generosity, we were able to distribute over **154 food hampers** to widows in the community. Goats, sheep, chickens, mattresses, and many other much-needed gifts were also given to children and their families, as well as to Ebenezer Children's Home.

The food hampers are such a blessing to the widows, especially at this time of year. Many are elderly and struggle daily to put food on the table. When they receive their hampers, their faces light up with big smiles – moments that truly reflect the hope and love behind every gift.



The children at the Children's Home are enjoying the festive season. They have been treated to ice cream—which they absolutely love—and have also received gifts from visitors to the mission.

As you may be aware, Charitable Institutions in Kenya also serve as *Rescue Centres* for abandoned and abused children. Over the past few weeks, five children have been brought to us to be cared for while their cases are being addressed by the Police and the Children's Department. Among them are a brother and sister, **Eunice and Junior**, who were found abandoned in a market stall by their parents. Junior is only three years old. **Myles**, also three years old, is another young boy who was found abandoned.

When the courts resume in January, their cases will be reviewed and appropriate solutions offered. In some instances, children remain with us; in others, the Children's Department is able to locate relatives who can take them in. This year, we received mattresses and clothing as Christmas gifts, which have been such a blessing and have helped us care for these young ones. Thank you so much for your generosity.

November and December are very busy months in Kenya. Alongside the Christmas Gifts project, many conferences are held during this time. In November, we hosted our **Mega Conference**, which was very well attended, with over **2,000 people** participating. Many attendees were accommodated and fed at the mission. These conferences are run jointly by **Prayer Ignition Network** and **African Word Ministries**, with funds raised throughout the year to support them.

Word Academy will resume in January 2026. At present, Paul and his team are busy preparing the school for the new year. This involves a great deal of work—classrooms need painting, desks and chairs require repairs, and many other preparations must be completed.

We would like to sincerely thank you all for your faithful support throughout 2025. We look forward to continuing to work together as we serve the people of Kenya. We wish you a **wonderful Christmas** and a **safe, peaceful, and blessed 2026**.
